# Harry Gealer 1891-1917

Harry was born in Cirencester in 1891 to Walter Gealer and mother, Fanny. Walter was a Gardener Domestic. Harry's siblings were Albert born 1885, Ruth born 1888 and Walter born 1889. Their address was Cottage, Shrivenham.

By 1911, Harry was a Gardener Domestic like his father. Later having enlisted in the Royal Berkshire regiment in 1915, he commenced active service in France on 18<sup>th</sup> May 1915. He was promoted to Lance Corporal but, sadly, was killed in action on 3<sup>rd</sup> May 1917. He is commemorated on the beautiful Arras Memorial in Pas de Calais. The absence of a grave indicates that his remains were not identified.

Following the war, Harry was awarded the 1915 Star, the Victory Medal and the War Medal.

# **Harry Gealer**

Born 1892 he was the youngest of three sons of Walter John a domestic gardener and Fanny, they had five children one of whom died. His older brother Albert was a gardener at Shrivenham House, but doesn't appear in the 1911 or 1901 census.

Harry was shown as a 19 year old domestic gardener in 1911.

L/Corporal in the 1<sup>st</sup> Battalion Royal Berkshire Regt. No 15850. Killed in action Flanders 3<sup>rd</sup> May 1917, aged 25.



The French handed over Arras to Commonwealth forces in the spring of 1916 and the system of tunnels upon which the town is built were used and developed in preparation for the major offensive planned for April 1917.

The Commonwealth section of the FAUBOURG D'AMIENS CEMETERY was begun in March 1916, behind the French military cemetery established earlier. It continued to be used by field
