The document was written up by the instructions of William Ward, gentleman, deputy to Samuel Hawkes, gentleman, the Steward among other things, of the Manor.

At this court the homage present that John Roby who held of the Lord of the Manor to him and his heirs by two several copies of Court Roll, all that One Cottage or parcel of land containing by estimation One Rood, situate in Longcot within the Manor with the Appurtenances. And also one other Cottage parcel of the manor lying and being in the East End of Longcot between the land now or late of Francis Lewis on the north and the land now or late of Martin King on the east, which last mentioned Cottage or great part thereof is lately decayed and fallen down and a Hovel or Roodhouse hath been lately erected on the whole or some part of the ground whereon the same stood, died lately seised thereof. And that Elizabeth Roby his widow ought to be admitted to the Custom of the Manor.

The wording goes on to describe how she appeared at the court and was granted her petition and explains the payment
