## Ashdown House

Built from designs by Webb, nephew  
& pupil of Inigo Jones. The estate  
was acquired by the first prominent  
member of the Gower family, Sir William  
Gower (born c. 1548, died 1618,  
Lord Mayor of London 1610-1611)  
in 1609 & remained in the family until made  
over to the National Trust by my late aunt  
Cornelia, Countess of Gower, after World War II.

This print was presented to my grandmother  
Evelyn, Countess of Gower, by the Marquis of  
Winchester as a memento of a visit  
in 1924 — shortly before she died.
