Ballinger children attending the school in the period 1868 to 1912 were:

George

Born: 06-10-1869

Edward

Born: 28-08-1871

Bertie (Herbert)

Born: 07-05-1880

Arthur

Born: 21-10-1882

All children of Sarah and Thomas Ballinger, and:

Nora (daughter of Edward)

Born: 22-06-1896; School 20-09-1899 to 19-09-1910

### 1901 Census.

Herbert lived at 164 Rodbourne Road, Swindon as a boarder, working possibly as an 'Iron Foundry Labourer' at the Rodway factory.

#### 1911 Census.

Sarah Ballinger/Ballenger, a widow of 62 years was living at 'census address' No 89 in Shrivenham with sons:

Charles aged 37; Thomas aged 33; Arthur aged 28.

She appears to have had seven children of whom five were still alive.

It looks as if, for whatever reason, Charles and Thomas did not attend Shrivenham School.

I can find no mention of Herbert in these census tables; presumably he died between 1901 and 1911. The other 'vanished' child may have died very young.

The figure overleaf is the detailed return for the Ballenger (sic) household in 1911.

Table 1 shows the page with Mrs Ballinger's household of "Three Males and One Female". This page includes the "Wesleyan Chapel" which could help locate where the Ballingers lived.

To help further in that, I have included Table 2, which shows the preceding page, including "Ivy House" where Captain Campbell lived.

I have not found any Ballinger boys in the school records from 1868 to 1908; there was a girl at the school around the turn of the century.
