Dear Mr. Roberts,

Thank you so much for your letter & the information you have given us, this now makes one step closer to finding out what happened to these children of William & Martha, where did they go when old enough to work.

I agree that there's a great possibility that when the records at Reading Records Office are searched, as Mrs Green the archivist - said there were many books of records of the Barrington Estate.

I think I told you I wrote to Mr Arthur Gordon of Longcot who answered my letter & he said he hoped to get to Reading over the Xmas period & he'd try to look up for us - also we are waiting to hear from Tony Tralles who is going to get onto a searcher at Reading for us. This now is the main "lead" & fact we need marriage Cert. of William & Martha.

I had a letter from dear old 90 yr old Martha Telling (of Spurwinkle) & she told me there are quite a few families of Telling - living at "Minty" ? Mintley? about 18 miles out of Sudenden. The menfolk (as a family of Gordons used to live in Spurwinkle) now live in

Fulham (looks like in her writing) a village near Shrewsbury - I wonder if it's there that our William & Martha married. The Telling family was a large one - believe this Martha's ^{father} husband Telling had 9 sons & 2 daughters. She mentioned one of these sons lived to 104!

I was wondering if you knew of someone in this village that I might contact - it's worth a try - in case these Tellings are of "our" Telling (Martha) I guess this is the only way we'll find anything in Shropshire or in Fulham (Boston).

Re George & I thank you for your time & interest to us in searching the records we needed so badly & should you find out any further details at any time would be so greatful. This Boston family certainly was a sad story & I hope & pray the other children in later life had a better life than their parents. Who says the good old day!

Please find enclosed a donation to your church's Restoration Fund. I was most interested in your notes re the St. Andrews Church.

Thank you very much for your help & kindness to my researcher "Tony Tralli" when he specially went all the way from Worcester to Shrewsbury, in order to obtain church records of our "Lupton" ancestors. Also many thanks for your personal notes on records held by St Andrews & George Green & myself were so thrilled to get this information & the beautiful photos of your delightful Shrewsbury that Tony took - in colour - Church & buildings, already put into our "Big" Lupton family album. I read with great interest the St Andrews guide that you forwarded - re the history of Shrewsbury the church, & I hope the church folk realize they have a truly lovely place of worship & that donations come in to help in your restoration appeal. Also the Parish news for August was read from cover to cover, even the addrs that go to help pay for printing.

Now a ? As your notes (to Tony) you listed the following names - MRS KNAPP - FRANK KNAPP - KATHLEEN also - others William Lupton & whom you've written & but unnammed (not our Lupton) Could you tell me their (obam) address as I know that in 1853 - may - Ann Lupton - wedd'd married Eliza Knapp (widower) & could Frank Knapp & Mrs K. be their descendants?

also Here's records of Ann Gorton's bday Bpt 25-11-1835 - "Ellen"
This Anne Gorton could not have been Elisha Knapp's wife -
was she the wife of Matthew Gorton (Ann Kent 13-10-1845) we
think that likely - & there were parents of "Ellen" are there any
details re parents in the Bapt. record held by your church?

also These names seem to suggest could be brothers/sisters of Joe:
William Gorton ^{wife Sarah Loyd 1701} & Thomas Gorton & son Matthew who wedd'd to Kate
Martha Gorton married William Johnson - 14-6-1809 (E. Bevers)
Hannah Gorton - " Edmund Ball - March 1810 ^{Vicks.}"

There maybe even more in the family - but these I have records of
also - could there be parents of our "William Gorton"?

Hannah Gorton died 1806 - age 56.
Henry " 1799 - "46"

Is there any record at all relating to who were children of
these 2? & were they man & wife - I havest they were.
also - Could there be any way I could find out what
happened to William & Martha's proposed children after they
died in 1821? I will describe to the local paper if you
can tell me where to write to.

also - I notice that a note from Tony Trattie states the church was
built in James ^{Starkley} & finished Charles I ^{as invited} C.R. are carved
on joist. It cost £4.000 - built by Mr. Fox? Sir Henry ~~Matthew~~
Master of Becket's estate. Sons William & Joseph J.

now George & I are wondering where George & Joseph J.
worked in 1824 - the time when the first meeting of
influential lords & business men in London to form H. H.
City - we have records to show that George was engaged
by the N.A. Loyd 1826 - age 23 - recommended to Mr. Robert
Dudson - of Becket's & Joseph was 15 yrs - engaged 1827

what we really want is some clue so where there 2 boys
worked up to this time - after death of both Parents - Cased
they have been employed by the Becker Estate & known
to the Company there for their knowledge of horsemanship
& general farming ability? I know this is asking a
lot, but we are trying to establish the place of
work when engaged to H.F. Co in Aug - & what
happened to Elizabeth, daughter of William & Martha,
it a truly sad case I know, Elizabeth would have been
about 11 yrs old at death of parents & couldn't have looked
after her brothers & sisters - Sophia & Charlotte & these
lives must have been looked after by someone.

clear up this now, it will be just life & never
established. I'd like anything on record after 1824

& record of this family of Gertons.

3. Ellen Gorton born 25 Oct 1835

was shown in Baptism Register as
being the daughter of Anne Gorton
who was described as a pauper, but
no mention of the father.

4. Matthew Gorton — we have no record in
our Church Register of his birth, ~~or~~
marriage or death

5. John Gorlin, born 1801 married Ann Sealy
on 11 March 1823 and died on 1825

6(a) On May 29, 1852 Ann May Gorlin, widow,
married Eliza Knapp, widower aged 60
Her age was given in the Register as 50

She was most likely the Ann Sealy
who m. John Gorlin (see 5 above)

7(b) Eliza Knapp died on 8 Feby. 1863 and age
given as 76.

Ann ^{May Knapp} Gorlin died 3 March 1870 and age
given as 66

Bear in mind that ages given on
marriage may have been understated.

8. William and Martha Gorlin.

A note in the Parish Overseers account
book for 1821 records that Wm died of
Small pox in April 1821 and that the Overseers
paid the doctor who attended him and also
paid the funeral expenses. A few months
later (Aug. 1821) Martha died & the Overseers
paid her funeral expenses.

time of the deaths of Mr & Martha,
and would have been responsible for
looking after the orphaned children.

~~Real~~ The Beckett estate was
broken up nearly 50 years ago and
in the 1930's the house and grounds were
purchased by the War Department and
is now the Roy. Mil. Coll. of Sc.

Dawson would therefore be able to give
first-hand knowledge of ~~the~~^{both} boys' abilities
and so recommend them to the Ant. Coy.

The elder boy would be already working
when his parents died & would therefore
not be a charge on parish relief funds.

9. As I mentioned to Mr Tralles there
appear to have been more than one
family named Gostan; I found on travelling
from village to village that there were
several families apparently unrelated but
they had no records, such as a family
bible in which it was customary amongst
country people to enter particulars of births,
marriages & deaths etc.

An Ann Gostan of Shrewsbury is recorded as
having died on 16 March 1853 aged 86. She

Two of the daughters of Wm Martha,
Sophia, born 23 March 1816 and
Charlotte born 10 June 1818 were
boarded out to foster parents at Littleworth
- a village about 10 miles distant from Shrews. -
by the Overseers whose records show
the cost of taking them to Littleworth (3/-) and
regular monthly payments for their keep for
some years. I can find no trace
of them at Littleworth and it is likely
that as soon as they reached the age of
12 or 13 were sent in to domestic service
but there is no record in the minutes
& accounts of the overseers.
The two ~~boys~~ other children, Esther Joseph & Elizabeth
~~two boys~~, George & Joseph were
boarded out on a Mr & Mrs Gosling of Shrews
and again there is a record of regular
payments until Feb 1825 when the
payments was reduced to cover just the younger
child and this ceased.

It is most likely that both boys were
employed on the Beckett Estate; they would
be well-known to Robert Dawson, who
was the Estate agent to Lord Banington and
who also was one of the Overseers at the

was shown in the Overseer Account book
as receiving parish relief for many
years. She was described as a widow but
I could find nothing further about her.
She would have been born in 1767
(assuming her ^{given} age at the time of death to
be correct)

10. The Church. The initials CR refers to
Charles II not Charles I. The church
suffered damage and deterioration during
the Cromwellian period, when John Wildman
(whose descendants became the ~~Vivians~~, later
Baring) who was a noted Anabaptist
and a thorn in the side of Cromwell, was
imprisoned for a number of years during
the years 1649-60. It was considerably
rebuilt at the expense of Sir Henry Marten
in the 1680's; the tower and ^{portion of} the west wall
~~were~~ were built in the ^{17th c.} century &
incorporated in the rebuilding of 1685.

The 2 girls Sophia born 23/3/1816

and Charlotte born 10/6/1818

village near Fingask and the others,
as record regular payments being sent
to Littleworth.

The 2 bays were boarded out on a
W^m R. Golding of Strichenburn. Again
regular payments to the Goldings
until in Feb 1825 when 1 bay only ~~was~~
& the 2 gals were paid for.

The elder bay may have been employed
on Lord Banff's ^{Beckett} Estate until he went
to India & thence to Australia. Robt. Dawson
was Estate Agent to L.B. and for a few

years was also one of the Overseers &
so would know the two boys - and so
would be in a position to assess the boys
abilities & recommend them to the A.A.C.
