Gustavious Henry J Pound 1896-1914

Gustavious was born in Wingham, Kent in 1896 to parents Stephen and Caroline. Stephen was a Jeweller and was born in Watchfield, Berkshire. Between 1901 and 1911 the family moved to Shrivenham. Gustavious' siblings were Doris born 1898, Gwendoline born 1900, Kathleen born 1902, Stephen born 1905 and Robert born 1909.

Gustavious enlisted on 14th August 1914 as one of the very earliest volunteers. He joined the Wiltshire Regiment as a private but very soon was promoted to lance corporal. Within two months of enlistment, Gustavious was fatally wounded and died on 15th October 1914. He is remembered on the Le Touret Memorial at Pas de Calais.

Gustavious was the only one of our heroes to be awarded the 1914 Mons Star as well as the Victory Medal and the War medal.


Gustavius was born in 1896 in Wingham, Sandwich , Kent. He was the oldest of 11 children of Stephen and Caroline Pound.

The Census of 1901 misspells the surname as Bund and shows the family living at Clifton House, Shrivenham.

In 1911 their address is given as Shrivenham, Berks (a house with six rooms) and Stephen is shown as Jeweller, Dealer.

He was in the 1st Battalion Wiltshire Regiment. Lance Corporal, Regimental Number 9045, died aged 18 of wounds in Flanders, 15th October 1914.







Le Touret Memorial is located at the east end of Le Touret Military Cemetery, on the south side of the Bethune-Armentieres main road.

From Bethune follow the signs for Armentieres until you are on the D171. Continue on this road through Essars and Le Touret village. Approximately 1 kilometre after Le Touret village and about 5 kilometres before you reach the intersection with the D947, Estaires to La Bassee road, the Cemetery lies on the right hand side of the road.

The Memorial takes the form of a loggia surrounding an open rectangular court. The court is enclosed by three solid walls and on the eastern side by a colonnade. East of the colonnade is a wall and the colonnade and wall are prolonged northwards (to the road) and southwards, forming a long gallery. Small pavilions mark the ends of the gallery and the western corners of the court.


