William Walter Hall 1880-1916

William was born in Shrivenham in 1880. His father was Henry, a farm labourer, and his mother was Charlotte. William had five siblings, Arthur born 1879, Charles born 1882, Martha born 1885, Edward born 1888 and Henry born 1891. By 1891 William had become a farm labourer.

In January-February 1906, William married Emily Georgina Butler. Emily was a dressmaker born in Wallingford in 1882. On the 22nd February, William and Emily emigrated to Canada. They sailed on the Tunisian to Saint Johns.

After war was declared by Britain, William enlisted in the Canadian Infantry but was, sadly, killed on the Somme on the 22nd September 1916.

The Somme Infantry battle started horrendously on the 1st July 1916 when on that day there were 57 thousand British and Empire casualties. 19 thousand of these were deaths. The battle continued for five months but poor William lasted only 22 days.

William is buried in the Puchvilliers British Cemetery in grave reference 111. D. 27 and I have marked this on the plan of the cemetery. You may note that the cemetery includes two sizable German Plots on the Western boundary. (Did the Germans get up early and leave their towels over these?)






