Dempsey Hinton

Dempsey Hinton came from ^①Chowan Co. NC.
to ^②Wilkes Co. Ga. 1773 ^③Johnston Co. NC

Probate Office Wilkes Co. Ga. - Land Grant to
John Benefield or Bedingfield Nov 19, 1773
(Ceded Lands) 100 a. on Chickasaw Creek
adjoining Richard Aycock and lands
whereon Dempsey Hinton now lives.

Dempsey Hinton was killed by John
Anderson in a fort in Wilkes Co. Ga 1779.

First Court of Wilkes Co. Ga. Aug 27, 1779
The Grand Juro^rs came into court and
presented two true bills of indictment,
one against John Anderson for taking
the life of Dempsey Hinton.

Orders of this Court: That John Anderson
be brought into court. The court ordered
the trial of John Anderson the prisoner
should be put off till the next Court of
Oir & Jeminer or General Sessions to be
helden in the county aforesaid and
that he do remaine in the custody of

the High Sheriff until he give satisfactory
bail to this court. Bail \$50,000.00. Refer-

Hempsey Hinton was killed
though not in battle as was
sometimes thought, but by
one Charles Anderson, in 1779
(as shown by court records
in Wilkes County.)

(Hempsey Hinton had a brother,
Le Ray Hinton who was
slain in battle at Kettle
Creek in Wilkes County
during the Revolution.

For record, old Mallorysville
in Wilkes, records birth
of one James Hinton, son
of Hempsey Hinton, in the
fort. His father was in
active service during
the Revolution.

Hintons, originally from
England, settled first in
Va., then our branch of the
family in N.C.; later in
Wilkes County, Ga.

in Wilkes Co. born in 1774.
Came to Wilkes from
N.C. in 1774. Killed in 1779.

died in 1837~~

~~Second wife was Clara Wells
mother of Mr. Henry Hinton~~

of Samuel Hinton) (brother)~~

Thomas, Clement & Richard Hinton,
sons of Mr. Sir John Hinton,
came to Maryland in 1666.

The N.Y. & Philadelphia Hintons
descend from Thomas.

Richard's descendants live in Baltimore. Clement died
unmarried. Tradition in
the N.Y. branch is that
the Hintons of Va. & N.C.
descend from Richard.

Mr. Wharton Wickinsone
of 204 East 16th st, New York,
descends from the Hintons
& has a chart, (Price \$10.00)

of the family running back
to the Norman Conquest

From Minutes of the court - Folio - page
91 - 1802.)

Elyabith Norman (County Rec.) refers to grand son
Henry N. Pope & Richard B. Morten "who married my
granddaughter Martha Hinton - mentions John Hinton
& James Hinton, sons in law; also mentions children of
her deceased son Lewis - 1822.
