American Hospital of Britain and the Harvard Field Unit were accepted into the Army Nurse Corps.<sup>74</sup> The policy of the Army Nurse Corps was that only graduate registered nurses should be eligible for enrollment. Being a military organization, there was not room for partially trained personnel. The policy of employment of members of the Voluntary Aide Detachment in American Hospitals was abandoned, following a conference with the Queen Alexandra's Imperial Military Nursing Service.

With a preponderance of young nurses in the United States, considerable difficulties had to be faced by the Nursing Division from the military point of view. Every effort was made to bring home to the nurses that they were in the army and must be aware of their responsibilities. This task was not easy, but with the opening of the Army Nurse Corps School this difficulty was to a large extent overcome.

On 23 March 1943 permission was obtained to organize an Army Nurse Corps School at the American School Center. The first class started on 19 May 1943 and was composed of all the principal chief nurses of hospitals then in the UK. The course lasted three weeks. The purpose of the school was to train each student to be able to perform duties of nursing, and to perform technical military nursing duties. On the staff were the Director, 1st Lieutenant Ruth M Momberger; Senior Instructor, 2d Lieutenant Alice R Dalton; Adjutant, 2d Lieutenant Juanit H Williams; Instructors, 2d Lieutenants Meredith E Reeves and Marjorie F Bracy. At the same time a school of Psychiatry for nurses was organized at the 36th Station Hospital.<sup>75</sup>
